

Fr. Ioan Irineu Craciun is a native of Romania who came to Ireland in 1981. In 1987 he was the first Easterner to be conferred with a Doctorate in Theology at the Pontifical University of Maynooth. In 1988 became an Irish citizen and since then has been teaching part-time at National Centre for Liturgy in Maynooth and Mater Dei Institute, Dublin. In addition, as a young priest he ploughed a lone furrow and participated in many ecumenical gatherings and important State occasions for over 25 years. He is married to Niamh Corbally, a Dubliner, who herself has a Doctorate in Biochemistry and they have two children.

Fr. Irineu's main concern is pastoral care of his people - first at the Greek Orthodox Church at Arbour Hill where he ministered to several minority ethnic groups and, at present, serving a Romanian parish consisting of some 200-250 young families of decent and diligent workers with children attending Irish schools.
